

Bamboo Fencer

Installing standard rolled fences to an existing panel fence:

You may also use the chain link instruction and attach using wire instead of fence nails provided you are able to wrap the wire around the horizontal rail or vertical pickets.

These instructions are intended for the following fence styles:

Bamboo Cane Fence, Bamboo Stick Fence, Bamboo Twig Fence, Fern Fence, Willow Fence, Reed Fence and Dwarf Pine Fence. For the other fence types please refer to the specific fence that you have ordered.

Tools and materials needed:

- Hammer
- Fence Nails (U-shaped nail)
- 2 people

Before you begin:

Make sure that the fence that you are attaching your roll out fence to is structurally intact and that the posts are securely in the ground.

Installation:

- Unroll the fence in 2' increments with 1 person holding the fence
- Secure top corner with fence nail wrapping around the wire.
- Be sure that the roll out fence is level when securing with fence nails.
- Repeat the above step every 15" or so at the top and bottom or as needed to keep the fence securely in place.

Tips:

It is preferable to keep the fence above ground level so that it does not sit on or in the ground. When exposed to constant moisture the fence will begin to deteriorate faster. You can do this by placing a 2x4 on the ground as support while installing the fence.

Longevity:

On our web site we give you a general guideline as to how long you may expect your fence to last. Please note that all fences are dependent on the structure that holds them up and how well they are secured.

Maintenance:

It is important to check your connection points from time to time to make sure that the fence is always securely fastened. We also recommend to check the strength of the structure that the fence is attached to (the posts and rails) to make sure that they are not failing over time.

Bamboo Fencer

It is very difficult to maintain the color of your fence when it is outside. Like all woods bamboo and other rolled fence materials typically turn silvery grey over time. The change in color varies a lot depending on the exposure to sun, rain and other outdoor elements. In areas where there is a lot of moisture the fence may turn a little darker in color.

While your fence will not regain the look you had when it was brand new it can be revitalized by power washing and applying a clear deck sealer (we do not make any particular recommendations for this, please consult your local hardware store or paint store).

Most roll out fences are strong enough to support their own weight up 2 to 3' above an existing fence. Example: attaching a 6' high bamboo fence on a 4' high panel fence.
